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Global History Student Contract

DESCRIPTION:

Welcome to Global Studies class! This term our class will examine the growth and interaction between empires, the rise of religious institutions and reforms and revolutions, and the development of enlightened despotism. Our class will consist of simulations, readings, class discussions and other activities with regular homework, multiple choice and written exams, and projects. There will be a written component in almost every class. Grades are cumulative and will be determined by a variety of assessments, such as exams, essays, projects, homework, as well as class participation, behavior, and your notebook. Success in this class is very much YOUR responsibility. Take charge of your studies and do your best. The following is what is required of you this semester.

I. CLASSWORK-20%

1. ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Attendance and active participation in class are expected and required; if you are absent, it is expected that you contact another student about topics and/or issues that were discussed in class and/or check the class website for notes and announcements.
- It will be YOUR responsibility to complete and submit missed coursework. You should have the work prepared when you return to school.
- If you are late to class, you must sign in the late log when entering class. Leave your pass on the late log, do not hand it to me. Excessive lateness and unexcused absences will negatively impact a student's overall grade.
- If you are absent on a test day, you will **not** be able to make up a test without a proper documentation. Please contact me ahead of time via email to schedule a make-up; be prepared to take the make-up the day you return.

2. CLASS PARTICIPATION

All classwork—written or oral—done in groups or individually—is assessed and contributes to the class participation grade

- It is expected when the bell rings, for you to be in your seat, with your notebook open, the date, aim, Do Now and homework copied down and that you are prepared to work as soon as directed to do so.
- Active participation is required. Personal conduct, and social contribution to the classroom community also influence this grade. There are many ways for students to earn full credit for class participation, this includes; raising your hand to volunteer answers, engaging in meaningful class discussions and debates, asking thoughtful/meaningful questions, responding to points or questions posed by other students, referring to course materials during class, taking initiative during group work, etc.
- Our classroom is a safe space for learning, interacting and sharing our thoughts and ideas, any disrespectful and disruptive behavior will not be tolerated. Behavior that will detract from your grade includes but is not limited to: having out your phone or other unrelated material, excessive lateness, excessive absence, inattentiveness, sleeping in class, inappropriate conduct, and being a distractive influence in class.

3. CUTTING (Please be aware of the Stuyvesant High School cutting policy)

- Students with more than 3 unexcused absences in a marking period cannot receive a 90 or above (thus students with 9 or more unexcused absences cannot receive a final grade of 90 or above)
- Students with more than 6 unexcused absences in a marking period cannot receive an 80 or above (thus students with more than 18 unexcused absences cannot receive a final grade of 80 or above)
- Students with more than 10 unexcused absences in a marking period cannot pass that marking period (thus students with more than 30 unexcused absences cannot pass for the term)

4. NOTEBOOK

- Students must keep a notebook and/or binder in which they keep all the materials required for class. Notebook quizzes will be given throughout the semester. Notebook quizzes check that the student is staying organized, attentive, and is being responsible in writing and keeping class content.
- Laptops and personal computers are **not** permitted to be used in class.
- The set-up for the required Global notebook as follows:
 1. **Class materials:** Course Requirements, Course Outline, Skills Handouts, Project Handouts and Rubrics.
 2. **Class work /Notes:** Each page should have the date, the class aim, and class notes. Related handouts should also be included.
 3. **Homework:** Clearly labeled with name, organized by date and homework number; All homework should be original and in your own words. Do not email your homework without permission.

II. ASSESSMENTS - 60%

- Classroom tests are based upon assigned HW, class discussions, and class notes, and should be seen as opportunities to reinforce and evaluate learning.
- At the end of this semester, you will have final exam or a final project, which will count as an assessment grade.
- Observe proper decorum during test days. Having out unrelated materials, or communicating with a classmate during or even after a test may be interpreted as cheating. Take no chances — clear your desk, put bags and all materials under your chair and don't talk while a test is starting or in progress.
- Students who engage in academic dishonesty will receive no credit on the assignment in question and your parents will be notified. Multiple offenses will result in further disciplinary action by the administration.

III. HOMEWORK-20%

- Homework must be submitted in class on the day that it is due. Students may turn in homework up to one day late for half the credit.
- Each assignment must have a full heading which includes your full name, date, period and homework number/or title of the assignment and be completed in blue or black ink.
- Homework is collected at the beginning of class, if you are late to class; it is your responsibility to submit homework before you leave.
- Do not hand me unstapled work or interrupt the class to borrow someone else's stapler!

IV. ACADEMIC DISHONESTY (CHEATING AND PLAGIARISM)

Discipline regarding plagiarism/cheating conforms to the school and to DOE policy. In signing this student contract you are acknowledging the following:

I understand that plagiarism is the act of submitting a piece of written work that, in part or in whole, includes the work of another person—work that I did not create. This includes, but is not limited to presenting the ideas of others without giving credit to the source, failing to provide adequate citations, copying from someone else's exam/paper/homework, submitting the same paper in more than one course, sharing or receiving exam answers or questions with another student.
